Inspect fencing. Some fencing is in need of repairs.

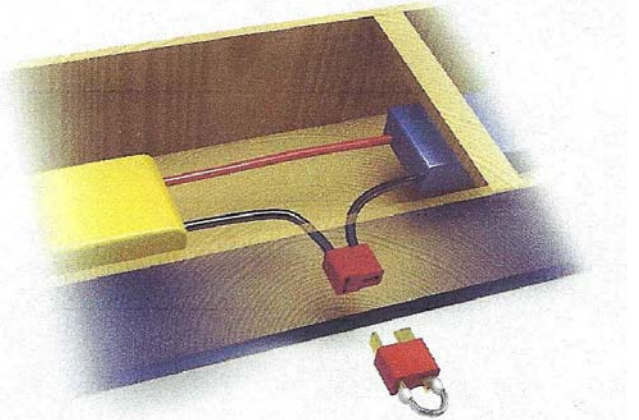
An antitheft anchoring system is needed for the mowers

## HOT TIP



### MAKING THE CONNECTION

On many electrics, I hate plugging in the battery and having a live motor near my hand as I seal up the battery compartment. To keep the power from the connection, I solder in a female Deans connector between the power wires going from the speed control to the battery. This is glued to the side of the fuselage with epoxy or CA. My key is a male Deans connector with a copper wire soldered between the Deans terminals. Now the power can be applied right before I am ready to fly.
